EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Tyler Hodgson is a partner in the Investigations and White Collar Defence Practice Group. Tyler practices primarily in the areas of corporate governance and regulatory compliance, as well as representing parties during regulatory, criminal and quasi-criminal investigations and prosecutions, both in a domestic and international context. Tyler is on an extended leave from Borden Ladner Gervais LLP. He is currently a Senior Investigator with the Integrity Vice Presidency (INT) of the World Bank Group, Washington DC.

While at BLG, Tyler regularly directed and managed international compliance reviews and government investigations. He is called to the bar in Canada, the United States, the United Kingdom and the Dubai International Financial Centre, and was named as one of world's leading investigative attorneys in the 2014-2017 editions of *The International Who's Who of Investigations Lawyers and Forensic Experts*. Prior to commencing his leave, Tyler was listed as the "most highly regarded" individual in the field of Investigations Law in Canada. He has been placed on a select roster of United Nations investigators (Chief of Section, Investigations) and is an adjunct professor at the Sandra Day O'Connor College of Law, Arizona State University, where he teaches a course on cross-border investigations and prosecutions.

On the compliance side, Tyler advised clients in relation to their obligations under domestic and international law, including anti-money laundering and foreign corrupt practice legislation. He routinely assisted in the drafting of domestic and multi-jurisdictional corporate policy manuals.

As a former Assistant Crown Attorney and Enforcement Counsel for the Ontario Securities Commission, Tyler also frequently represented individuals and corporations during all stages of the criminal and regulatory process, ranging from the active investigation of suspected unlawful activity — often involving the execution of production orders, search warrants and compelled interviews both in a domestic and cross-border context — to the post-charge prosecution and sanctioning phases.

In the busiest court house in Canada, Tyler prosecuted hundreds of cases ranging from shoplifting to first-degree murder as an Assistant Crown Attorney. Tyler was also Enforcement Counsel with the Ontario Securities Commission, a role in which he investigated and prosecuted cross-border capital market offences, including insider trading, market manipulation and unregistered trading and advising.

In 2006, Tyler accepted the position of Manager of the Enforcement Division of the

Dubai Financial Services Authority, where he was involved in a number of international prosecutions for fraudulent conduct and appeared as counsel before the DIFC Court. Before returning to Canada, Tyler was named Chief Legal Officer for Dubai First International, a consumer finance subsidiary of Dubai Holding. As CLO, Tyler was responsible for supervising compliance and company law matters in relation to international finance projects (both conventional and Sharia'a compliant) in emerging markets, including Oman, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Malaysia and Russia.

Tyler has extensive litigation experience and has appeared in all levels of court in Canada, including the Supreme Court of Canada, the Ontario Court of Appeal, the Superior Court of Justice (Ontario), the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia, and the Court of Queen's Bench, Alberta, on both jury and judge alone trials. He has also appeared before the United States Bankruptcy Court, District of Nevada, and the Dubai International Financial Centre Courts. While at BLG, he regularly acted for foreign governments in relation to criminal, regulatory and extradition matters. He represented individuals and corporations charged with a wide variety of criminal and quasi-criminal offences, including charges under the *Criminal Code of Canada*, as well as acting for individuals subpoenaed to testify in proceedings.
